Or they can do all of these things at different stages.

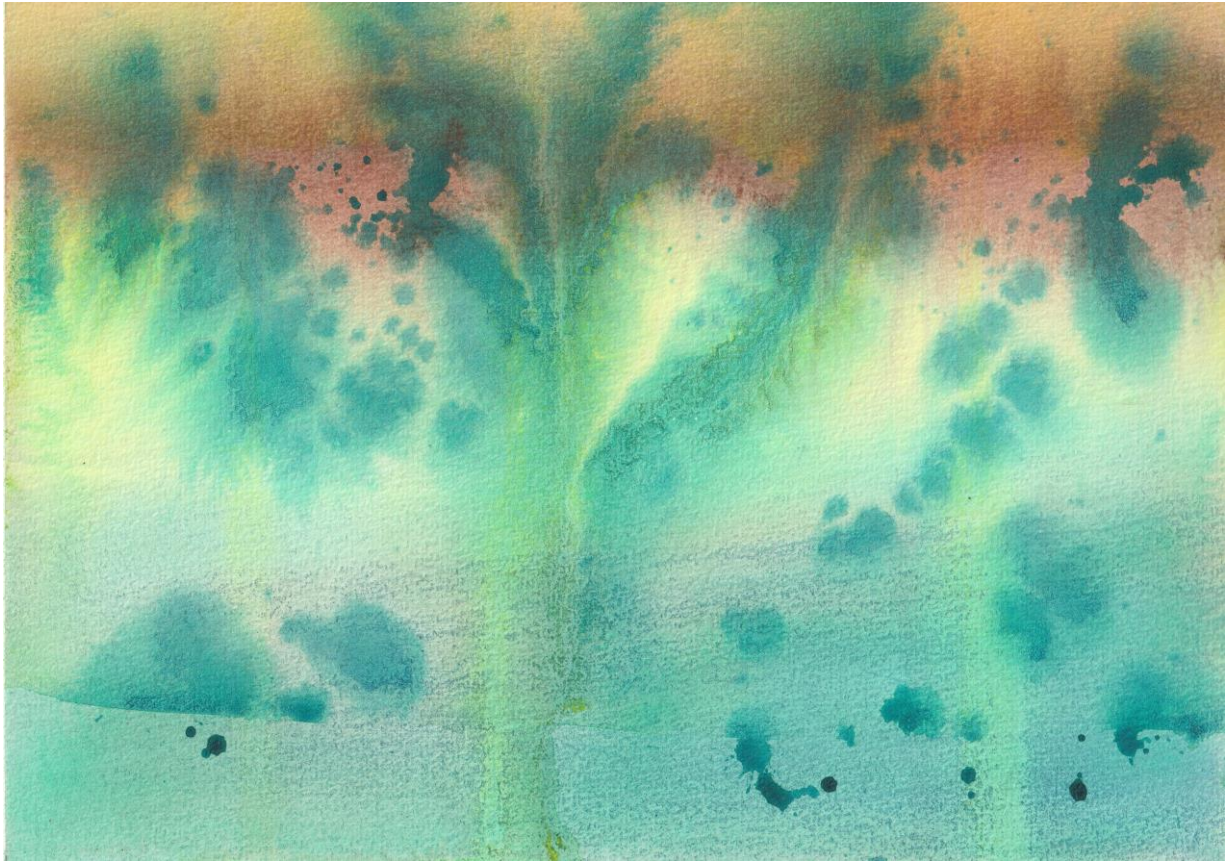


My current work investigates and illustrates the visual and emotional impact of colours interacting in various ways. Some experiments evoke a calm and tranquil experience while others create an energising effect. I aim to offer viewers an experience rooted purely in the influence of colour, which is why these pieces are never figurative. Occasionally, shapes emerge that might provide an effect similar to a Rorschach test, encouraging viewers to let their imaginations wander. Some works may resemble landscapes, with two contrasting areas of colour meeting along a horizontal line. However, since the focus is entirely on colour, orientation is not fixed—each piece can be viewed in whichever orientation the viewer feels drawn to.
